Mattress Recycling (What to Expect)

Where onsite are we collecting them and when?

Onsite, the mattress collection for recycling will take place near the Green Waste/ Scrap Metal Diversion area. The first empty trailer will arrive on Friday 6/16/2023. Clear signage will guide customers to the designated drop-off area and mattress stacks.

Why are we recycling mattresses?

92-95% of mattresses are recyclable
Diversion from the Larimer County Landfill (An approximately 2.5-mile-tall stack was landfilled in 2022 alone)
Less wear/tear on landfill equipment
Creates new products (recycle steel, foam, wood, and other materials)
Creates recycling jobs

What mattresses must be rejected?

Bed bug infested, wet, frozen, moldy, and hospital beds (list may be extended once recycling begins)

***In addition, on mud restriction/rainy days, the access road is not all weather and mattresses will go directly to the landfill working face.

Why do we charge a separate fee for mattresses?

Fees will remain the same for the rest of 2023 and will increase again in 2024.

Mattresses are large, bulky, and do not compact like other materials in the landfill. They take up a significant amount of airspace and soil cover. In addition, mattresses can cause damage to landfill equipment due to their size and composition, leading to increased maintenance and repair costs.

**So why is there still a charge if they are now being recycled?

Mattress recycling is an expensive, labor-intensive process that is most often completed by hand. In addition, they need to be managed by landfill staff and transported to Denver which also creates additional costs.

Which company is recycling them?

Spring Back Colorado. They are located in Commerce City, Colorado.

"It is Spring Back CO's goal to help ease the burden of landfill waste collected and increase mattress and box spring diversion from landfills throughout the state. When we receive a mattress, we break it down by hand into individual components. Each of those components (steel, wood, foam, cotton, ticking) are all baled individually into large 500-900 pound bales. When we get around 30,000 pounds of each material, we call for a truck. All materials are loaded onto the truck. The foam and ticking goes to California to be repurposed, the steel stays in state and goes to Rocky Mountain Scrap, the wood goes to BioChar, and the cotton goes to Arizona. We typically recycle about 75,000 pounds of steel per month, 70,000 pounds of foam and ticking per month, and 30,000 pounds of wood per month."
